The TALISMAN Old Fox Event and Dinner 2012

To be sailed on Saturday December 15th and open to all members of the TYPBC, Omokoroa BC and Katikati YC trailer yacht fleets.

DESTINATION: Katikati River Basin. Note high tide Katikati is predicted to be about 1030.

RULES: As per YNZ Handbook and Collision Regulations.

COMMUNICATIONS: Use VHF channel 06 as usual.

OBJECTIVE: The objective is to cross the finish line at the Katikati Beacon as soon as possible *after* 1100 hrs. Be aware this is after high tide to allow better opportunity to pass through the stakes for boats from Tauranga. You will be travelling against the tide upriver and there is a slightly higher risk of being stranded by the falling tide, please be vigilant and follow the channel.

START: Start from wherever you like. At 1030 hours you must be outside the area north and west of a line bounded by Kauri Point (37o 30.97'S, 175o 58.67'E), the GRG beacon (37o 31.52'S, 175o 58.85'E) then trending southwards as delineated by the green channel markers to the beacon at 37o 33.56'S, 175o 59.04'E, and thence westwards by the Katikati sewage pipeline (37o 33.70'S) as shown on Chart NZ 5411, you may not use either your motor or anchor within this area at any time.

COURSE Sail whatever course you like except that you must sail a proper course for the finish line for the final half nautical mile. Use whatever sails you like, you may also move your boat by paddling or rowing or towing your boat with your dinghy.

FINISH: The finish line will be between the Katikati marker beacon and either a finish boat or buoy. In the event no finish boat is on station record your own finish time and hand to the organiser before 1600hrs.

AFTER RACE: Dinner (at your expense) and prize giving at The Landing (Talisman Hotel) beginning 1800hrs.

GENERAL INFORMATION: The channel up to Katikati has been remarked and should be accurate and clear of stumps but follow the markers closely. The mangroves have also been mulched and must not be used as a guide to the edge of the channel. Note that there has been a build up of silt by the wharf and around the corner past the old ramp so prepare to go aground at low tide in this area.

The Talisman has again generously sponsored the event and prizes will be awarded at the dinner. Unfortunately the local Club is unable to provide breakfast as in the past. Those of you wishing to live it up will be able to buy food and coffee at a local cafe, details will be announced at the dinner. If not, then your on board facilities will need to go into service.
