## THE COMMUNITY PATROL NEEDS YOU!

The Omokoroa Community Policing Group incorporates

The Patrol, vehicle surveillance by volunteers of the peninsular reporting to Police

Graffítí Busters, regular checks and removal of any damage by

## vandals

Police Information Centre, operated by volunteers 3 mornings per week for 2 hours to take any reports of damage or concerns residents may have, these are faxed immediately to Police. Community Constable Matt Elliott is in attendance every 2nd Friday or as required.

Neighbourhood Support, the peninsular is divided into a large number of groups of properties with a coordinator in charge of each group to distribute information as required. Rena disaster was a great example of this and will also be used in the case of a civil emergency.

The Community Patrol part of our Policing Group needs more volunteers. For the last 6 years we have had a fairly dedicated group of volunteers who have patrolled the streets on a roster system 3 night per week. In recent times a number of our regulars have had to resign due to circumstances beyond their control, age sickness, leaving the district, etc .We **URGENTLY** require about 20 more residents to join the patrol to enable us to maintain our presence deterring antisocial behaviour before it gets a hold. This involves one night every 2-3 months for about 2 hours driving our purpose equipped surveillance car with video cameras, spotlights, mobile phone link to Police and Police radio. The patrollers (2) per shift record any suspicious behaviour or vehicles and these reports go to Police for follow up. The job is surveillance not action, that is Police work.

*Full training is given, as well a a Police check of all potential patrollers.*
